### Llanwrtyd Wells' "Have a Field Day" Opening of the Diamond Jubilee Pavilion

The sun shone brightly on Dolwen Field on the afternoon of Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> May, where a sizeable group of Llanwrtyd residents had gathered for the opening of the newly refurbished Diamond Jubilee Pavilion, the renovations of which had recently been finished. The building work, having been funded by grants from The SITA Trust, The Welsh Aggregate Levy for Wales, and prize money from the 2009 Calor Village Of The Year Wales competition had been carried out by a local family contractor, who despite having a tight budget and time schedule, managed to complete the considerable amount of work.

Previously a run down, sad eyesore, the pavilion is now a clean, bright, modern facility with disabled access, which can be enjoyed by the whole community for everything from sports events to functions and conferences. The official opening was carried out by the Town Mayor, Cllr June Newman, who thanked everyone who had been part of the initiative and said that its success was down to people who are willing to commit and to the vitality of the community.
