Preamble:

The Diamond Jubilee Pavilion on Dolwen Field, Llanwrtyd Wells was built in the 1970's and has recently been completely refurbished inside and out thanks to grants totalling £45,000 awarded from the Aggregate Levy for Wales and SITA UK. Other funding has been met by private donations, fund raising events and prize money from the Calor Village of the Year Award which was bestowed on Llanwrtyd Wells in 2009.

No dogs or pets of any kind allowed (with the exclusion of Guide Dogs for the Blind). Dolwen Field is a Dog Exclusion Zone with a possible fine of £1,000 for non-compliance.

There is to be no sleeping in the Pavilion.

Please ensure all lights, heaters and water heaters are switched off before you leave and that the building is securely locked. Thank you.

No motor vehicles allowed on the field.

Users of the venue are reminded that the River Irfon runs alongside the field and for safety sake, children should always be supervised if playing outside the pavilion.
