

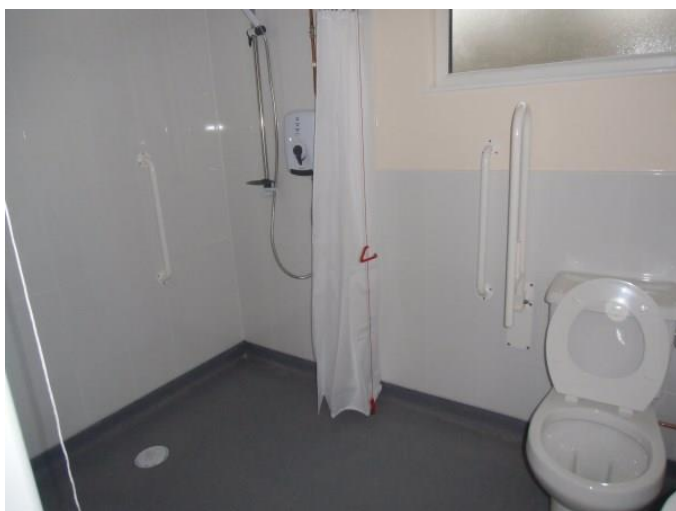
Cyngor Tref Llanwrtyd Town Council Diamond Jubilee Pavilion, Llanwrtyd Wells



Official Opening Saturday May 4th 2013

The kites soared along with people's spirits at the official opening of Llanwrtyd's newly-refurbished Diamond Jubilee Pavilion on Saturday 4th May.

With funding from the SITA Trust, the Aggregate Levy for Wales Fund and prize money from Llanwrtyd's successful bid in the 2009 "Calor Village of the Year – Wales" award, together with donations from the public, the sadly-rundown pavilion has been transformed into a sparkling amenity



for residents and visitors alike, and now boasts of a large meeting room,

new kitchen, up-to-date toilets and showers with full disabled access. Work was carried out by a local, family building contractor, meeting a tight timescale and budget.



On a sparkling spring afternoon, residents enjoyed a barbecue, entertainment from the local primary school and fun-filled activities.



The Town Mayor, Cllr June Newman, performed the official opening. She thanked everyone who had played a part in the initiative and commented on the strength and vitality of the local community, emphasising the importance of people who are prepared to commit and deliver.



Also joining in on the day were members of LW-PARC – a group of young mothers who joined forces with Llanwrtyd Town Council to secure funding from the Aggregate Levy for Wales for the renovation the children's play area. There was a cake raffle and a "penny trail" to raise funds for the completion of the project.
